TONIGHT'S GAME -- Tonight's game between the Mean Green and the Golden Panthers marks the fourth meeting between the two schools with North Texas holding a 2-1 series lead after a 38-19 FIU last December 1 in the final college football game played in Miami's historic Orange Bowl Stadium.

The last game these two schools played in Denton was one for the ages with an NCAA Record seven overtimes in a 25-22 North Texas victory. The first game of the series took place during the 2005 season with a 13-10 Mean Green victory in Miami.

These two programs have a lot in common:

Both head coaches are in their second seasons as a college head coach and after 16 games in their intercollegiate careers, both sport identical 2-14 career marks. FIU's Mario Cristobal moved up through the college ranks after stints at Rutgers and Miami (Fla.). UNT's Todd Dodge moved into college coaching after a career as one of the most respected high school football coaches in America.

Both teams are basically home grown as 92 of the 102 players on the Mean Green roster (90.2-percent) come from the state of Texas while 88 of the 103 players on the FIU roster (85.4-percent) come from Florida.

Both teams are extremely young. North Texas has played a total of 16 freshmen (11 true and five redshirt) over the first four games of the season. FIU has played a total of 15 freshmen (11 true and four redshirt) over the first four games of its schedule. Only three schools have played more true freshmen than have UNT and FIU: Florida State (22), SMU (13) and Iowa State (12).

And neither program has run from playing some of the top programs in the country. The four teams that defeated North Texas this season sport a combined 14-3 overall record, including No. 3 ranked LSU. The Golden Panthers, on the other hand, have met opponents currently with a 12-6 record, including No. 10 USF and No. 16 Kansas.

HILTON EARNS SUN BELT PLAYER OF WEEK HONORS – Freshman **T.Y. Hilton** was named Monday as Sun Belt Conference Football's Special Teams Player of the Week, it was announced in New Orleans today. Hilton returned two kickoffs for 80 yards, including a 55-yard return to open the third quarter en route to a touchdown, which gave FIU a lead it would not relinquish last Saturday night during a 35-16 come-from-behind road victory at Toledo. Hilton also returned one punt for 17 yards and scored the Golden Panthers' first touchdown of the game with a 37-yard pass reception from quarterback Paul McCall.

BUZZSAW BRYANT – Junior linebacker **Scott Bryant** leads FIU with 35 total tackles and his 147 career stops put him just 26 behind **Lionell Singleton** for sixth place on the all-time career list.

UP NEXT – The Golden Panthers return home to FIU Stadium next Saturday to take on Middle Tennessee in a 7:00 pm contest. With the Blue Raiders, the Golden Panthers will play four of their last seven games of the year at home.

HEAD COACH MARIO CRISTOBAL (Miami, Fla., 1993) begins his second season as head football coach at FIU with a 2-14 career record...Prior to his appointment at FIU, Cristobal spent three seasons as tight ends/offensive line coach at the University of Miami (Fla.) where the Hurricanes compiled a 24-12 record and appeared in the 2004 and '05 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and the 2006 Micron PC Bowl...Cristobal spent the prior three years as an assistant at Rutgers, helping turn the Scarlet Knights into one of the top programs in the BCS...He was a four-year letterwinner and member of the UM football team from 1988-92, earning All-Big East honors as an offensive tackle in 1992...Cristobal signed with the Denver Broncos as an undrafted rookie in 1994 and played for the Amsterdam Admirals in NFL Europe in 1995 and '06 before beginning his coaching career...Cristobal is the third-youngest head coach at the Football Bowl Subdivision level. Only Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald (33) and Western Kentucky University's David Elson (37) are younger than Cristobal who turns 38 on September 24.

FORMER PURDUE CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR BILL LEGG is FIU's new offensive coordinator...Legg, 45, coached five seasons at Purdue and was co-offensive coordinator for the last two...Last year, the Boilermakers led the Big Ten in total offense (435.92 yards per game) and scoring offense (34.31 points per game)...A four-year starting center at West Virginia University from 1981-84, and was head coach Don Nehlen's first recruit with the Mountaineers... Legg was drafted by the Birmingham Stallions of the United States Football League and subsequently had a brief stint with the Washington Redskins in 1985.

Here is a quick look at the other FIU assistant coaches:

- **Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers - Phil Galiano** (2nd season): A four-year member of the Rutgers staff working with the defensive ends for two seasons, coaching the linebackers in 2004 and working with the defensive line in 2003.
- **Special Teams Coordinator - Apollo Wright** (2nd season): Helped FIU to finish third among Sun Belt Conference teams in kick-off returns, punt returns and punting...Spent six seasons at Villanova as the running backs coach and special teams coordinator and helped with the development of Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro Brian Westbrook.
- **Recruiting Coordinator/Running Backs - Mike Cussano** (2nd season): Sent three years at the University of Miami as a volunteer coach and offensive graduate assistant, coaching in the 2004 and '05 Peach Bowls and 2006 Micron PC Bowl with the Hurricanes.
- **Defensive Line - Bernard Clark** (4th season): Served as FIU's defensive coordinator in 2004 and '05 before moving on as defensive line coach at the University of South Florida in 2006...His USF defensive line helped the Bulls defense rank 14th nationally in sacks, 21st in scoring defense and 26th in total defense.
- **Offensive Line - Greg Laffere** (2nd season): Spent two season at FCS power Illinois State where his offensive line paved the way for Redbird All-American running back Pierre Rembert in 2006 set the ISU record for rushing in a season with 1,743 yards and 16 rushing touchdowns.
- **Tight Ends - Alex Mirabel** (2nd season): Coached on the South Florida high school scene for 13 years prior to joining the FIU staff...Helped Miami Christopher Columbus High School to three district championships in four years as the Explorers offensive line coach and run game coordinator.
- **Wide Receivers - Frank Ponce** (2nd season): Another local career high school head coach, and FIU alumnus, who was a five-time assistant coach in the Miami-Dade/Broward All-Star Game and an assistant on the USA Team of the 2007 NFL Junior Global Football Tournament.
- **Defensive Backs - Jeff Popovich** (2nd season): A two-year defensive graduate assistant at the University of Miami, working primarily with the secondary and assisting with special teams...letter four years after walking on at UM.

HOMEGROWN TALENT: Of the 103 players listed on the most updated FIU football roster, 88 (85.4-percent) come from the home state of Florida. The roster also includes a pair players from California, Georgia and New York, plus each from Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Nebraska, New Jersey, Tennessee and Virginia.

SERINI NAMED TO RIMINGTON WATCH LIST – Sophomore center **Brad Serini** was named to the Rimington Trophy 2008 spring watch list this past summer, and is one of just six sophomores on the 42-man list. Serini started all 12 games at center at FIU as a true freshman in 2007 and he played all but a handful of snaps during the season. Rimington, the award's namesake, was a consensus first-team All-America center at Nebraska in 1981 and '82, during which time he became the John Outland Trophy's only double winner as the nation's finest interior lineman.

REAMS JOINS THE 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB – Senior running back **Julian Reams** second TD run of the game against Toledo from 27 yards gave him 1,025 yards on his career and made him the third runner in school history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a career. Reams would later go on to score his third rushing TD of the game (first time since Ben West vs. Florida Atlantic, 11/26/05).

PHILLIPS SWITCHES SIDES – Senior **Alonso Phillips** has come a long way since first walking onto the team prior to last season. Last season, Phillips came on and started four of the eight games he played at safety as well as a special teams standout. But this year, look for No. 25 on offense as the former FIU track sprinter has lined up at a wide receiver this fall and two weeks ago at Iowa, he made his first career pass reception, good for 12 yards.

In 2007, Phillips led the team with 15 tackles on special teams and ranked second on the squad with 17 kickoff returns for 352 yards (20.7 yards average). He began his collegiate career at Liberty University, where he competed in track and field and football. He transferred to FIU as a sophomore and continued his career in track for two years, setting an indoor school record in the 400-meter dash (48.31) and posting an NCAA Regional qualifying time of 10.46 in the 100 meters.

YOUNG PANTHERS CONTINUE BAPTISM OF FIRE – The Golden Panthers had six true freshmen see playing time in the season opener against Kansas and over the first four games this season, FIU head coach Mario Cristobal has played 11 true freshmen and four redshirt freshmen. Only three schools have played more true freshmen than FIU this season, Florida State (22), SMU (13) and Iowa State (12). The Golden Panthers opponent tonight, North Texas, has also played 11 true freshmen this year. FIU also played 11 true freshmen play in 2007 when the team was the second-youngest in the FBS, behind only Temple.

QUARTERBACKS SPLIT TIME – FIU junior **Paul McCall** and sophomore **Wayne Younger** continues to split playing time over the Golden Panthers first four games of the year. McCall has been the starter in all four and has completed 32-of-70 passes for 272 yards with one-touchdown but five interceptions. Younger is 14-of-29 for 178 yards and no touchdowns or interceptions.

NOTES FROM THE TOLEDO GAME

- T.Y. Hilton's 37-yard TD reception from Paul McCall was the first passing TD of the season for FIU. It was Hilton's second TD of the season (74-yard punt return at Kansas). The 6-play, 74-yard scoring drive was the team's longest of the campaign.
- FIU's 14-13 lead with 7:14 remaining in the second quarter was its first lead of the season. Prior to that, FIU's last road lead was 9-3 at the half in Jonesboro, Ark., against Arkansas State on November 3, 2007.
- Marshall McDuffie recorded his first career sack vs. QB Aaron Opelt at the Toledo five, setting up Reams' third rushing TD of the game (first time since Ben West vs. Florida Atlantic, 11/26/05).
- A'mod Ned's 7-yard TD run was his first of the season and career eighth. This is the first game with four rushing TDs since November 19, 2005 at home vs. Western Kentucky.
- The FIU defense shut out Toledo in the third quarter marking the third straight game that the Golden Panthers have not allowed an opponent to score a point for the first 15 minutes after the half. The 35 total points scored were the most since 38 in a 38-19 win over North Texas on 12/1/07.
- Down 13-0 after one quarter, FIU climbed out of its biggest first-quarter deficit to win since trailing Middle Tennessee, 14-0, and winning a vacated 35-31 game on December 3, 2005.

FIU MEDIA RELATIONS POLICIES

General Statement: Credentials for FIU home football games are for working media only. Spouses, dates, children under 18 and other non-workers are not permitted in working media areas in compliance with the working codes of the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

Press Policies: Working space in the press box is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Credentials will be issued according to the following criteria:

- 1.) Local and state newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area and student newspapers from FIU and opponent's schools.
- 2.) Other daily newspapers with preference to those that regularly cover FIU.
- 3.) Radio and television personnel not broadcasting but considered reporting (seats may be provided in the stands).
- 4.) Non-daily newspapers with preference to those that regularly cover FIU.
- 5.) Scouts.

Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be requested as verification of a writer's status.

Photo credentials will be issued on a game-by-game basis. FIU adheres to all NCAA guidelines regarding sideline photography that limits shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard line.

Practice Attendance: Working media may only attend the first 20 minutes of weekday practice sessions. During the season, the team's day off is Monday. Media planning on attending practices should first check in with Assistant Athletic Director/Media Relations Rich Kelch. THE FIU LOCKER AND ATHLETIC TRAINING ROOMS ARE OFF LIMITS TO THE MEDIA.

ON THE TUBE: The ESPNU game telecast against No. 12 USF on Sept. 20 was the first nationally-televised home contest ever for the Golden Panthers. But it certainly won't be the only televised game of the year. FIU's game against Iowa on Sept. 6 was televised by the Big Ten Network, and tonight against North Texas (Oct. 4) and in two weeks against Troy (Oct. 18) will be broadcast on ESPN+, as part of the Sun Belt Conference's television package.

FOURTH-DOWN SUCCESS: The Golden Panthers offense has enjoyed some outstanding success on fourth-down conversions of late. In the team's last two games, coaches have "gone for it" on five occasions and have been successful all five times. FIU was only 1-of-6 on fourth-down conversions over the first two games of the year.

TIME IS NOT ON OUR SIDE: The Golden Panthers offense has yet to win time of possession over the team's first four games and that's mainly do to the team's slow starts. The closest FIU came to winning time of possession came last week at Toledo when the Golden Panthers controlled the clock for 29:03 and that was after having the ball for only 3:25 of the first quarter.

HONOR ROLL: The Golden Panthers had 162 student-athletes named to the Sun Belt Conference Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0-or-high GPA. That number represented 46% of FIU's total number of student-athletes. Head coach Mario Cristobal's football squad earned a solid 2.63 grade point average, the highest average in the seven year history of the program. Overall, 30 football players, or 31-percent of the team, finished the Spring 2007 semester earning academic honors of 3.0 GPAs or higher.

THE GRADUATES: Quarterback Paul McCall, tight end Moses Hinton and defensive back Marshall McDuffie enter the 2008 college football season with degrees already in hand. McCall, who earned his bachelor's degree in electrical engineering, Hinton in sports management and McDuffie in business management received their diplomas in graduation ceremonies over last summer.

LARGE CROWDS THE NORM: FIU has opened the 2008 football season playing in front of some of the largest crowds in their brief history. The Golden Panthers opened the campaign playing before 52,112 at the University of Kansas--a record number for 88-year old Memorial Stadium and then performed in front of 70,585 the next week at Iowa. Two weeks ago's announced 16,717 spectators at the opening of the new FIU Stadium was the program's fourth-largest home crowd.

NEW VOICE IN FIU RADIO BOOTH: Jeremy Marks-Peltz joins long-time color analyst Randy Kassewitz in the FIU radio booth in 2008. Marks-Peltz, who becomes the youngest FBS play-by-play voice, is the sports director at Miami's Clear Channel radio station WIOD (610 AM). He replaces Phil Schoen, who held the position for five seasons.

NEW FIU STADIUM OPENS TO RAVE REVIEWS

A new era for FIU football began last Saturday, September 20 when FIU hosted the No. 12-ranked University of South Florida Bulls in brand-new FIU Stadium. All along, the Golden Panthers have set aggressive goals and have been committed to competing at the highest level. FIU is building this tradition of excellence with Athletic Director Pete Garcia, Head Football Coach Mario Cristobal and this new on-campus stadium.

Since breaking ground on May 25, 2007, stadium construction has occurred under the auspices of Coral Gables, Fla., based Odebrecht Construction, Inc. The stadium's first phase includes a capacity of 18,000 and features 1,440 club seats, a 6,500 square foot Stadium Club, an upper concourse and 19 premium suites. Seating includes both chair back and bench seating with backrests for fan convenience. Additional phases of construction will include a student support complex and will bring the stadium's seating capacity to approximately 45,000.

FIU's new stadium became the only Division I on-campus football stadium south of Orlando in Florida.

Nearly two-thirds of the stadium project will be funded from existing sources like athletic fees, game guarantees and existing vendor contributions. In addition, ticket sales will be applied toward financing improvements. The new stadium complex also opens the door to other sources of revenue like corporate sponsorship packages and naming rights, in addition to concerts, non-intercollegiate sporting events and other community activities that will take place at the stadium.

Future phases for the stadium include an adjacent 100,000 square-foot student

center that will house undergraduate advising, admissions, financial aid and an alumni welcome center. Most of these services have been located on University Park in the Charles Perry Building.

Odebrecht Construction, which has been operating in Florida for nearly 20 years, has been responsible for building another Miami sports icon—the American Airlines Arena—and the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts of Miami-Dade County.

The stadium will also be the home of the brain trust of the FIU Football program with the completion of a two-story, 50,000-square foot fieldhouse scheduled for spring of 2009.

Highlights of the new fieldhouse include a 12,500-square foot clean span weight room that will be used not only by Golden Panther football players but all FIU student-athletes for their strength and conditioning needs.

Visitors will be greeted in a reception area that will also include a Hall of Fame area. The first floor will also contain an equipment room, athletic training complex, ticket office and 8,500-square feet of locker rooms for players and coaches.

The fieldhouse's second floor will feature coaches' offices, a theater-style team meeting room and six breakout rooms, which overlook the field, for smaller gatherings. Those rooms also open to a deck that will be used for recruiting and game-day entertainment.

FIU STADIUM FAST FACTS

It will be the only Division I on-campus football stadium south of Orlando in Florida

The first phase of construction will bring the stadium's capacity to approximately 18,000 and will include:

- 1,500 club seats
- 6,500 square-foot Stadium Club
- An upper concourse and 19 premier suites
- Chair back and bench seating all with backrests for fan convenience

Additional phases of construction will include a new fieldhouse, state-of-the art weight room, a student-support complex and will bring the stadium's seating capacity to approximately 45,000.

- Like FIU, North Texas has faced a very difficult early schedule this year, with the four teams that have beaten the Mean Green combining for a 14-3 overall record. Two of North Texas' losses came to teams that are undefeated at 4-0 (LSU and Tulsa).

- North Texas has yet to hold a lead in any of its first four games this season. The Mean Green has fallen behind all four of its opponents and has never come back to tie or take a lead later in any of the games. But the size of the initial lead by UNT's four opponents without a Mean Green answer has diminished each week. In week two against Tulsa, it was a 14 point lead before North Texas got on the board. Week three vs. LSU, North Texas was down 10 before it scored and last week against Rice, it was only behind seven when it scored.

- Six turnovers by North Texas against Rice were the most since the team returned to Division I-A status in 1995. That dropped North Texas to last in the Sun Belt Conference and 115th nationally (out of 119) in turnover margin. Rice turned those six Mean Green turnovers in 28 points.

- North Texas is fielding a very young team in 2008 with a total of 16 freshmen (11 true and five redshirt) playing in the first four games. There are 10 true or redshirt freshmen on the two-deep and a total of 23 freshmen and sophomores on the offensive and defensive depth chart.

- The North Texas offense has had success when it has been inside the red zone, scoring all eight times with six touchdowns and two field goals. The Mean Green is one of only eight teams in the FBS that is perfect inside the red zone this season, but is tied for second with the fewest number of trips inside the opponent red zone.

- North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round.

- Of the 102 players on the North Texas roster in 2008, 92, or 90.2 percent, come from the state of Texas. The player furthest from home on the North Texas roster is Jacob Kaiser from Greensburg, Pa.

- North Texas wide receivers Casey Fitzgerald and Sam Dibrell are ranked first and third respectively in the Sun Belt Conference in receptions per game. Fitzgerald has averaged 7.8 catches per game while Dibrell has averaged 6.0 in the first four games. Fitzgerald also ranks second in the league in receiving yards per game at 69.2 while Dibrell ranks sixth at 58.2.

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) - Todd Reesing threw three touchdown passes to Dezmon Briscoe and No. 14 Kansas, coming off the greatest season in its history, opened with a 40-10 victory Saturday over FIU before a record-breaking home crowd.

Reesing, who rewrote the Kansas record book last year during a 12-1 season that vaulted the Jayhawks into national contention, was 37-for-52 for 256 yards. Briscoe, a sophomore and Reesing's third-leading receiver in 2007, had touchdown catches of 3, 4 and 3 yards against a Sun Belt team the Jayhawks smacked 55-3 a year ago.

Briscoe's third TD, on fourth-and-goal from the 3, was a leaping grab in the corner of the end zone after Reesing appeared to have overthrown his wide-open target.

The game was played before a school-record crowd of 52,112, breaking the mark of 51,910 which watched the resurgent Jayhawks beat long-time nemesis Nebraska 76-39 last year. It also broke by 4,000 the Memorial Stadium record for a non-conference game.

Kansas took a commanding lead with a 23-point second quarter that made it 30-10 at the half.

Reesing also threw an interception which Jeremiah Weatherspoon returned 20 yards to the Kansas 27 in the fourth quarter. A year ago, he had only seven interceptions. But a few minutes after the interception, Phillip Strozier made his second interception for the Jayhawks. His first was returned 30 yards and set up Briscoe's third touchdown.

The Golden Panthers, 1-11 last season, were playing the highest-ranked team they have seen since becoming a major college program in 2006. They got their only touchdown in two games against Kansas when T.Y. Hilton took a punt and sped 74 yards into the end zone in the second quarter. Dustin Rivest had a 43-yard field goal for FIU at the end of the half.

The Jayhawks lost a fumble on their first possession. But Jake Laptad sacked FIU's Paul McCall for a 5-yard loss on fourth down midway through the first quarter and Jocques Crawford, last season's junior college offensive player of the year, scored on a 7-yard run for Kansas.

Briscoe capped a 56-yard scoring drive with his first TD catch on the first play of the second quarter. A few minutes later, Daymond Patterson, a freshman, broke loose for a 75-yard punt return, jumping over one would-be tackler near the 20 who had been blocked to the ground.

Alonso Rojas, replacing departed Scott Webb, kicked a 47-yard field goal in the second quarter for a 17-0 lead and added a 37-yarder in the third as the Jayhawks won for the 16th time in their last 18 games overall.

McCall was 10-for-28 for 73 yards, with two interceptions.

IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) - Ricky Stanzi threw three touchdown passes in his first start, Shonn Greene ran for 130 yards and Iowa pounded FIU 42-0 for its second straight blowout win.

The Hawkeyes, who routed Maine 46-3 last week, looked even better against the Golden Panthers. Stanzi, who got the start over Jake Christensen, was 8-of-10 for 162 yards in less than a half as the Hawkeyes (2-0) racked up 512 yards and led 35-0 at halftime.

Christensen came on and was 8-of-12 for 99 yards and one touchdown. But it was clear Stanzi has taken the lead in the competition to be Iowa's starter the rest of the season.

FIU (0-2) had no answer for Iowa's defensive front, which stopped the Golden Panthers all day. The Hawkeyes had six sacks, and when they weren't slamming quarterbacks Paul McCall and Wayne Younger to the turf they were stuffing running lanes and forcing both to hurry throws.

Younger came off the bench and was 11-of-20 for 107 yards to lead FIU, which lost for the 25th time in 26 games dating back to 2006. The Golden Panthers have now been outscored 82-10 this season.

The Hawkeyes rolled up 209 yards of total offense and a 21-0 lead in the first quarter.

Iowa scored on its opening drive for the second straight week, after failing to get any points on opening possessions last season. Greene capped that drive with a bruising 11-yard TD run, bouncing off a number of defenders before stretching the ball over the goal line.

Stanzi made it 14-0 with a 59-yard touchdown pass to Derrell Johnson-Koulianos. Stanzi hit Johnson-Koulianos in stride about 40 yards downfield, and Johnson-Koulianos used some nifty footwork to sidestep defenders near the out-of-bounds line and reach the end zone.

Christensen came in for Stanzi and threw a third-down pass into the turf on his first attempt, drawing a chorus of boos from the Kinnick Stadium faithful.

That was quickly forgotten, as Paki O'Meara pushed Iowa's lead to 21-0 with a 17-yard TD run late in the first quarter.

Iowa made it 28-0 on a screen pass by Stanzi that Brandon Myers took 23 yards for a touchdown. Stanzi then hit Colin Sandeman for an 8-yard TD pass with 2:49 left in the first half.

Christensen, who played just two series in the first half, got the nod to start the second half. He pushed the lead to 42-0 on a 23-yard TD pass to Sandeman early in the fourth quarter.

Greene, who spent last season at a junior college because of academic trouble, passed the 100-yard mark for the second straight game. Sandeman's touchdown grabs were the first two of his career.

MIAMI (AP) - Mike Ford ran for two short touchdowns and South Florida spoiled FIU's debut in its new on-campus stadium.

Matt Grothe completed 14 of 22 passes for 137 yards for South Florida (4-0), but was held without a passing or rushing touchdown for just the second time in his 30-game career.

FIU (0-3), which came in ranked last among all FBS schools in total offense (178.5 yards per game) and scoring (5.0), got a 61-yard catch-and-run from Wayne Younger to T.Y. Hilton with 2:03 remaining, setting up Julian Reams' 1-yard TD run - the Golden Panthers' first offensive touchdown this season.

USF linebacker Brouce Mompremier was injured after colliding with teammate Carlton Williams while attempting a tackle with 6:43 left in the third quarter. USF officials said Mompremier - a Miami native who had family at the game - was moving his arms and legs and was expected to remain hospitalized overnight for tests and observation.

The Bulls fumbled the ball away on their first possession, started their second series on the USF 1, and needed 13 plays before Ford rushed in from 2 yards out for first points ever recorded at the stadium. FIU safety Jeremiah Weatherspoon forced the turnover on the opening drive and knocked the ball loose twice on the next drive as well, but USF kept possession and took the early lead.

From there, though, FIU's defense held tough, keeping the upset hope alive.

"We played with a lot of passion, a lot of energy that helped us out," Weatherspoon said. "We just made a few mistakes that cost us."

The stadium is on the same site as FIU's previous football home, a 7,000-seat facility that was more suited for high school games than big-time college football. The current structure - which still lacks a scoreboard on one end, isn't yet enclosed on the visitors' side and will eventually have

a massive field house attached to it - was built in 16 months.

Building FIU into a winner is taking a bit longer.

The Golden Panthers have lost 26 of 27 games since the start of the 2006 season, but have long pointed to the opening of the stadium as the first significant step toward a turnaround. And recruits in talent-rich South Florida are quickly taking notice; a slew of players from the Miami area have already committed to enroll at FIU next fall, and plenty more attended the stadium's debut.

Hanging close to a nationally ranked team wasn't a consolation prize, Cristobal said.

"Our guys are as down as they can possibly be," Cristobal said. "But it does say something. It does say that we can do some things that can make us have a successful season."

TOLEDO, Ohio (AP) - Julian Reams rushed for three touchdowns to lead FIU to a 35-16 win over Toledo Saturday night.

Reams' first TD put the Golden Panthers (1-3) in front 14-13 in the second quarter. T.Y. Hilton returned the second half kickoff 55 yards, and on the next play, Reams ran 27 yards for his second score to put FIU ahead to stay, 21-16.

Reams finished with 75 yards on 19 carries. Hilton caught a 37-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.

"Every day, this coaching staff and this team works its tails off to be a better program because they believe in what's going to happen here at FIU," Cristobal said after the school's first road victory against a nonconference Football Bowl Subdivision team. "Last week, we got closer, fighting toe-to-toe with USF. It was time to punch through on the road against a nonconference opponent.

"We realize we're miles away, but we came out on an emotional high, executed well and won the football game."

After scoring only one touchdown in its first three games combined, FIU generated 239 yards of offense and five scores. With the defense limiting Toledo to just 146 yards after the first quarter and the special teams making numerous big plays, FIU had more than enough firepower for Toledo.

The Rockets (1-3) jumped out to a 13-0 lead and led 16-14 at the half, but couldn't score after the break. They gained FIU 302 yards of total offense, but committed four turnovers, three of which led to Golden Panther touchdowns.

"I was a little bit alarmed [when they led 13-0] because we had had such a great performance against South Florida," Cristobal said. "We felt we had a good week of practice on defense, and we were so sharp -- we felt we had a bead on what they were doing."

Toledo's Morgan Williams gained 98 yards on 25 attempts, while Nick Moore caught nine passes for 65 yards.

"Our offensive line played well, and our backs were stepping up and making plays," quarterback Paul McCall said. "That's what carried us tonight."

FIU opens its Sun Belt Conference schedule next Saturday, October 4, when the Golden Panthers travel to Denton, Texas, and take on the North Texas Mean Green. The game will be televised live on ESPN+ as part of the SBC television package and can be seen in the South Florida area on Comcast Sports-Southeast.
